

PATIENT CONSENT FOR MRI CONTRAST ADMINISTRATION

It may be necessary to give you an injection of a contrast medium called Gadolinium to complete your MRI scan.

The contrast medium provides the Radiologist with additional information used for the diagnosis.

Gadolinium is a safe drug and adverse reactions are rare. It is excreted from your body through your kidneys usually within 24 hours if your kidneys are functioning normally.

Our radiologists will not prescribe contrast to patients who are in the high-risk category.
